Burt Solomon is the author of *Where They Ain't*, about the Baltimore Orioles of the 1890s, and two books of Washington history. *The Murder of Willie Lincoln* is his first

novel. A Baltimore native and Harvard graduate, he has written about Washington's political, social, and cultural dynamics for more than three decades. At *National Journal*, he won the Gerald R. Ford Award for Distinguished Reporting on the Presidency in 1992. He is a contributing editor at *The Atlantic*. He and his wife and family live inside the Beltway.

David Dalin



David Dalin, Ph.D., an ordained rabbi and widely-published scholar of American Jewish history and politics, has taught Jewish history at

several universities. He has been a Visiting Professor at George Washington University and the Jewish Theological Seminary, and the Taube Research Fellow in American History at Stanford University. Dr. Dalin's newest book, *Jewish Justices of the Supreme Court, from Brandeis to Kagan*, was published this April by Brandeis University Press. It is the first history of the eight Jewish men and women who have served or who currently serve as Justices on the United States Supreme Court. Dr. Dalin received his M.A. and Ph.D. from Brandeis University. He received his Rabbinic Ordination, and a second M.A., from the Jewish Theological Seminary.

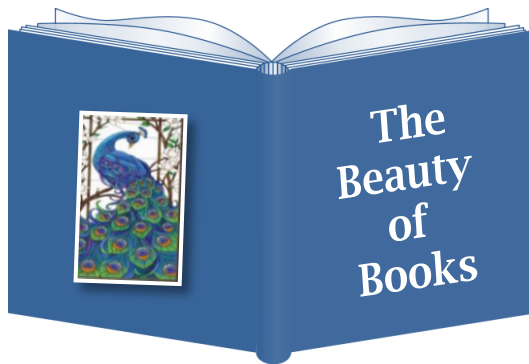
